Chair McGuckin called the meeting to order at 11:00 am, and introduced Lori Ruest, who has transitioned from our Town Accountant position to our new Town Administrator, who will also be overseeing financial activities in town and our Town Budget.

1. Approve Select Board minutes of the November 15 & November 21, 2022 meeting:

Chair McGuckin's first order of business was a motion to approve the minutes of the November 15 and November 21, 2022, Select Board meetings. The Select Board tabled this to the next agenda and Select Board meeting.

2. Public Questions and Answers:

Curt Springer, 98 Cranfield Street noted to the Select Board there is a plaque on the wall with a misspelling.

3.Route 1B Causeway:

Chair McGuckin noted that at the last Select Board meeting, NHDOT gave a presentation on the effect of the sea level rising and the causeway. There was a concern that New Castle is not on the current 10-year plan and where this stands with Rockingham Planning Commission and NHDOT on this concerning issue and making it a priority and within the 10- year plan. Selectman Stewart and Selectwoman Finn suggested writing letters to David Walker, of the Rockingham Planning Commission and to NHDOT from the residents, State Reps and making a letter campaign to stress the importance of this to New Castle residents. Accessibility and safety issues are a major concern for New Castle. Curt Springer, 98 Cranfield Street, suggested State Reps get involved as well and voice their opinion of the importance of this matter. Darcy Horgan, Planning Board Chair stated it would also be a good idea to get all Land Use Boards to get involved and to also get their input and concerns heard as well to the Rockingham Planning Commission, and to NHDOT. Chair McGuckin thanked everyone. This matter will be further discussed at future meetings.

4.Proposed American Revolution Sign:

Chair McGuckin noted that any proposed signage to be in the Historic District must go before the Historic District Commission (HDC) and suggested this be remanded to them for review and consideration.

5. Town Safety, Regarding Emergency Vehicle Access:

Selectwoman Finn mentioned there was discussion between Fire Chief Ted Hartmann and Police Chief Don White about the concern for emergency vehicles being able to get through Walbach and Piscataqua Street, and Salamander Lane. It was proposed that Walbach from Main Street to the bend and Piscataqua from Walbach to Salamander Lane no parking zones. This will be discussed further.

6. Proposed Special Events Contract, Permit:

Town Administrator Lori Ruest addressed the Proposed Special Events Contract/Permits with the Select Board and Town Officials, and final revisions will be voted on at a future Select Board Meeting.

7. Committee Reports:

Chair McGuckin noted that both Police and Fire Reports were received and will be attached to the minutes.

8. Other:

The Select Board confirmed the next Select Board meeting will be on Tuesday, January 3, 2023, as Monday is an observed holiday.

9. Adjourn:

Selectwoman Finn made a motion to enter into a non-public meeting, Selectman Stewart seconded and the meeting entered into a non-public meeting @ 12:55 pm.
